Storm Preparedness

The National Weather Service is predicting that Hurricane Sandy may affect New Hampshire beginning Monday, October 29, 2012. To prepare for a possible power outage, review the following:

- If you use a generator, please follow ALL of the manufacturer's instructions to ensure safe operation. Please contact your electrician or your electric utility to discuss how to safely use your generator. Improper use of generators may create significant health and safety risks to you, your family and others, including utility line workers and emergency responders.
- If you have life sustaining equipment that needs power to operate please have a plan in place for a power outage. Notify your electric utility of your circumstances. If you have medication that needs refrigeration, make a plan to keep refrigerated medication cold.
- You may wish to protect sensitive electric equipment by unplugging it to prevent damage from any power surges.
